# Town News

## **Island Manager's Comments**

Greetings Everyone,

**Ferry:** I have spoken with the Naval Architect that performed the stability and inclination tests on the ferries. He said that the final report is in the mail and we should have it this week; but he stated that the ferries were very stable even when the heaviest vehicle allowed to travel on Maine roads was applied to the model. I don't know how voluminous the report is but I will make it available, in some form, for those who are interested. I have asked him to do another model to determine the amount of downward travel in the ramp when these heavy vehicles are loaded on the ferry on the mainland side. This information will be helpful when we consider loading heavy vehicles at different water levels.

**Special Town Meeting:** A special town meeting has been scheduled for **9:00 AM Saturday September 2<sup>nd</sup>** at the Community Center. The primary purpose is to vote on the future of the Growth Management Ordinance. The Planning Board has scheduled a public hearing on Saturday, the 19<sup>th</sup>, to present a revised Ordinance. The Board of Selectmen / Executive Committee (BoS / EC) previously held two hearings to get input on the existing ordinance. The BoS / EC voted at its last meeting to present a warrant article for the special town meeting to rescind the Growth Management Ordinance. The Planning Board will also draft a warrant article for the special meeting based on its position relative to the Ordinance and the input received at this Saturday's meeting.

The Town Charter establishes the procedure for revising Land Use Ordinances and requires that all revisions to the Land Use Ordinances be approved by the Board of Island Trustees (BIT) before being presented to the registered Town voters. The Growth Management Ordinance is part of the Land Use Ordinances and therefore we must follow this procedure when considering any revision, including rescinding the Growth Ordinance in its entirety. Therefore, any warrant article which affects the Growth Management Ordinance will be presented to the BIT voters for approval first, if approved, the registered Town voters will then be able to vote on the article. If the BIT rejects the article, the registered Town voters will not be allowed to vote on the article and it will be considered defeated. If the BIT voters approve the article but the registered Town voters reject the article, it will be considered defeated. If both bodies approve the article it passes and becomes effective. I think that covers all of the possibilities.

In order to be a member of The Board of Island Trustees, an individual must be a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age, and an owner, or a spouse of an owner, of real property located within the Town of Frye Island with a fixed home currently occupied by the person. There is a maximum two people per fixed home.

**Board of Appeals:** The Board of Appeals meeting originally scheduled for Friday August 25<sup>th</sup> has been rescheduled for Saturday August 26<sup>th</sup> at 9:30 AM at the Community Center.

**Septic Tank Pumping Permit:** Paul White has been working with the Portland Water District to establish a septic tank pumping permit system. A number of other communities within the Sebago Lake watershed area have this system. This process was approved by the BoS / EC at its last meeting. Before having your septic tank pumped now, you will need to get a permit. This can be initiated by the home owner or the hauler. The haulers are familiar with the system and will be given blank applications to help expedite the process. There is a \$5.00 fee, paid to the Town, for processing the permit application. A copy of the permit will be retained in the lot file and a copy will be forwarded to the District. One difference with the permit system involves the dumping fee that the District charges. In the past, the District would charge the Town the \$50.00 dumping fee for all septic waste hauled to their facility and the Town would bill the home owner. Now the hauler will bill the home owner directly for all waste transported to the District. Your cooperation in transitioning to this new system is appreciated.

**Police and Safety:** The vandalism and theft continue to be a problem on the island. This week a Moped was stolen from a property owner's yard and a contractor reported the theft of two pneumatic-nailers from a job site. In addition to these reported thefts, someone pounded on the conduit for the new lighting system at the Marina with a heavy steel rod until it broke and then pulled the wires out of the conduit. During this same period, the restrooms at the Marina were vandalized. These acts affect everyone. We had to purchase and install new conduit for the marina lighting and re-run the wire. We also had to schedule additional cleaning of the restrooms. You had to pay for this!!! Last year a number of boats in the Marina were vandalized and one boat was stolen. Last year feces were spread all around the Marina restrooms several times. Now we have this. I was also told that some people have been using the wooded areas at the end of the causeway for a bathroom and have

spread toilet paper all over. In addition, we are frequently finding empty beer cans and beer bottles strewn around the long beach area. It is really becoming disgusting.

Unfortunately, it is the actions of a few that affect the many. In addition to the added cost, we are now going to lock the restrooms earlier and we are considering the installation of a security gate on the causeway road.

Granted, it won't prevent all of the problems that we are having but it will make it more difficult. If you know of or hear of anyone committing this vandalism please let us know.

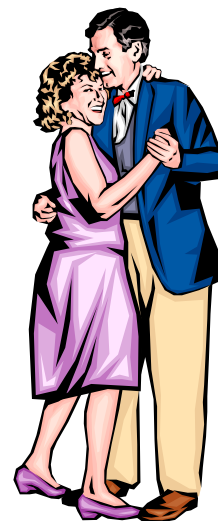
## ***FII SURVEY REPORT***

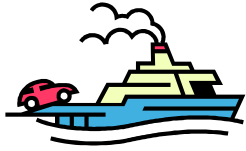

## **Home Candle Fires**

Do you use candles in your home to decorate?

According to the National Candle Association, candles are used in seven out of ten households in the United States.

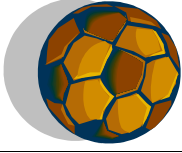
Most people don't view candles as a fire hazard, but the numbers of home candle fires is steadily increasing. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) reports from 1983 through 1997 candles in the home caused an annual average of:

- 8,690 fires
- 104 civilian deaths
- 947 injured
- Estimated direct property damage of \$126 million

Nearly half of home candle fires started in the bedroom, with 19 percent starting in living rooms, family rooms or dens. Thirty-six percent occurred because candles were left unattended, abandoned or inadequately controlled.

A candle is an open flame that can easily ignite nearby combustible materials. The NFPA offers the following safety tips:

- Use candles only with constant adult supervision.
- Extinguish all candles when leaving a room or going to sleep.
- Keep candles away from items that can catch fire, such as Christmas trees, clothing, paper or curtains.
- Place candles and candle holders on a secure piece of furniture.
- Make sure candleholders are non-combustible and large enough to collect dripping wax.
- Do not place lighted candles in windows, where blinds or curtains can close over them.
- Keep wicks trimmed to one-quarter inch, and extinguish candles when they burn to within two inches of the holder.
- Keep candles and all open flames away from flammable liquids.
- Do not use candles in places where they can be knocked over by children or pets.

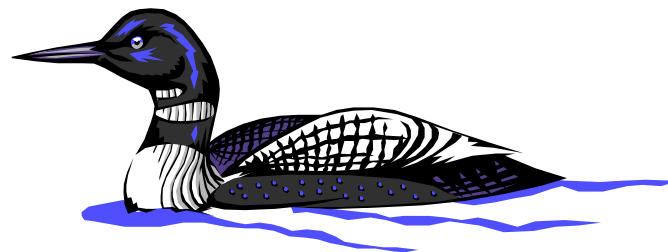

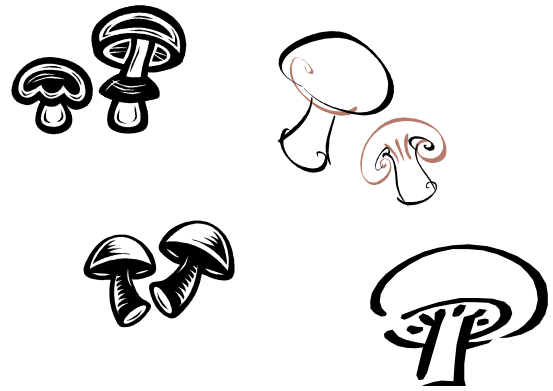

## **2006 Member-Guest Tournament**

**Date** August 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>, 2006

**Entry Fee:** \$190 per team (\$95 per player)

**Sign-up Deadline is August 12th.**

**Meals:** Saturday continental breakfast, Saturday lunch, Saturday dinner (spouses are invited), and Sunday lunch.

**Format:** Nine hole Match Play, best ball, 2 person teams.

**Tees:** Men play Silver for Matches 1 and 3, Gold for Match 2, Shoot-Out and Consolation; Women play red throughout.

**Matches:** Two matches on Saturday and one Match on Sunday to settle Bracket winners. (Four teams in a bracket or three team brackets playing third match against par). On Sunday afternoon, Flight winners will participate in a Shoot Out; all others will participate in the Team Consolation Round.

**Handicaps:** Guests shall submit evidence of USGA/GHIN Handicap Index or at least 5 recent 18 hole cards (slope and rating required for each) to Tournament Committee (Mark and/or Bruce), which will assign handicaps for the Tournament. In all match play, strokes are determined by subtracting the lowest handicap from each player's handicap. Half points, if any, shall be used in the match.

**Match Scoring:** Each Match is worth 9 points – 1 for each hole. A team gets 1 point if they win the hole, and each team gets ½ a point if they tie the hole. The loser of the hole gets no points. Each Team must record its gross score for each hole on the score card, as well as the results of the match. The Flight Winner is the team that accumulates the most points from teams within their flight.

**Ties:** In the event of a tie for first place in the Flight, the method for breaking the tie shall be applied in the following order:

- 1) Team that won the head to head match.
- 2) Team that did better against Third Place team in flight.
- 3) Team that won the first full point in their Head to Head match.
- 4) Team that wins a chip-off.

**Shoot Out:** Handicapped as in the Matches. All Flight winners will engage in a Sudden Death Shoot Out. One team will be eliminated each hole (by chip-off, if necessary) until two teams remain, which teams continue to play until there is an outright hole winner (no chip-off).

**Consolation:** Team Consolation Round is scored as the sum of the low net scores of both players on a team. A tie will be broken by Chip-Off.

**Other Contests:** Putting and Chipping (Saturday Afternoon before dinner)

**Awards:** Overall Winner, First in Flight, Team Consolation Low Net, Putting (1st and 2nd) and Chipping (1st and 2nd).
