

**WARRANT TO CALL MAINE SCHOOL ADMINISTRATIVE DISTRICT NO. 6
BUDGET MEETING
(20-A M.R.S.A. §1485)**

TO: Kenneth Young, a resident of Maine School Administrative District No. 6 (the "District") composed of Buxton, Frye Island, Hollis, Limington and Standish, State of Maine.

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify the voters of each of the municipalities within Maine School Administrative District No. 6, namely, Buxton, Frye Island, Hollis, Limington and Standish, that a District Budget Meeting will be held at Bonney Eagle Middle School, Sukokis Trail, Buxton, Maine at 7:00 p.m. on April 30, 2009 for the purpose of determining the Budget Meeting articles set forth below.

ARTICLE 1A: To elect a moderator to preside at the meeting.

ARTICLE 12: To see what sum the District will appropriate for the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act and to see what sum the District will raise and assess as each municipality's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 15688.

Explanation: The District's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act is the amount of money determined by state law to be the minimum amount that the District must raise and assess in order to receive the full amount of state dollars.

ARTICLE 13: To see what sum the District will raise and appropriate for the annual payments on debt service previously approved by the District voters for non-state-funded school construction projects, non-state-funded portions of school construction projects and minor capital projects in addition to the funds appropriated as the local share of the District's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12.

Board of Directors Recommends \$1,246,435.00

Explanation: Non-state-funded debt service is the amount of money needed for the annual payments on the District's long-term debt for major capital school construction projects and minor capital renovation projects that are not approved for state subsidy. The bonding of this long-term debt was previously approved by the District voters.

ARTICLE 14: (Written ballot required). To see what sum the District will raise and appropriate in additional local funds (**Recommend \$1,367,198.42**), which exceeds the State's Essential Programs and Services allocation model by (**Recommend \$504,080.19**) as required to fund the budget recommended by the Board of Directors.

The Board of Directors recommends \$1,367,298.42 for additional local funds and gives the following reasons for exceeding the State's Essential Programs and Services funding model by \$504,080.19: These additional local funds are necessary to meet costs of providing education in areas where essential programs and services have been reduced and have traditionally been underfunded through State subsidy. Those areas include Special Education, Leadership, Transportation and Heating Oil.

Explanation: The additional local funds are those locally raised funds over and above the District's local contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act and local amounts raised for the annual payment on non-state funded debt service that will help achieve the District budget for educational programs.

ARTICLE 15 SUMMARIZES THE PROPOSED SCHOOL BUDGET

ARTICLE 15: To see what sum the District will authorize the Board of Directors to expend for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2009 and ending June 30, 2010 from the District's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act, non-state-funded school construction projects, additional local funds for school purposes under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 15690, unexpended balances, tuition receipts, state subsidy and other receipts for the support of schools.

ARTICLE 16 AUTHORIZES EXPENDITURE OF GRANTS AND OTHER RECEIPTS

ARTICLE 16: Shall the Board of Directors be authorized to expend such other sums as may be received from federal or state grants or programs or other sources during the fiscal year for school purposes provided that such grants, programs or other sources do not require the expenditure of other funds not previously appropriated?

ARTICLE 17 AUTHORIZES THE ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAM AND RAISES THE LOCAL SHARE

ARTICLE 17: Shall the District appropriate \$248,230.00 for Adult Education and raise \$112,654.00 as the local share; with authorization to expend any additional, incidental or miscellaneous receipts in the interest and for the well-being of the adult education program?

Board of School Directors Recommends a "YES" vote.

Note: The adult education recommended local share to be raised (\$112,654.00) includes the following amounts to be raised from each member town: Buxton (\$29,136.72); Frye Island (\$7,258.86); Hollis (\$17,960.65); Limington (\$12,760.77); and Standish (\$45,537.00).
